On Wednesday, I was sworn in with thirteen other women in the Senate, making up the first-ever women's majority in the Senate Democratic Caucus. As Senator, I'm excited to deliver results for SD 36 and families across the Commonwealth. I have introduced a slate of legislation to support public education, improve the lives of Virginians, lower the cost of living, ensure students are prepared for the challenges ahead, advocate for criminal justice reform, address the mental health crisis, and support first responders.



## Legislation that I have introduced this session

SB 225 Requires that parents receive a letter from their school reminding them about the importance of storing weapons safely so children can access them. We need to do everything we can to prevent gun violence

- <u>SB 385</u> This bill will require the Department of Education establish a work group with experts, professionals, and educators to study the use, integration, and effects of AI technology in our schools and universities.
- <u>SB 387</u> Requires that public schools and teachers are trained and possess narcan to assist students expierencing an overdose.
- SB 388 Requires that all mandatory fees are disclosed. This bill will ensure that ticketmaster tells you what you're paying up front. No more confusion on other services because you don't know the real price/
  - SB 389 This bill re-establishes the Autism Advisory Council.
- <u>SB 390</u> Ensures that children and adults with epilepsy who die under circumstances that are labeled "SUDP", get the autopsies they deserve so we can understand more about these sudden and unexplained deaths so that we know more to prevent these tragic deaths.
- <u>SB 391</u> Ensures that both state and municipal employees, like our firefighters, have the same protections as other people in Virginia when using prescribed CBD products.
  - SB 392 Mandates that all Emergency Room departments in Virginia have at least one physician present in the ER at all times.
- SB 393 Makes diversity and gender balanced board of directors part of the scoring requirement for companies looking to recieve a state funded Major Employment Investment
- SB 395 Ensures that our student athletes across the state will have a mental health screening during thei yearly sports physicals. Helping address the mental health crisis that our students are facing by checking in with them at every chance we have is one way that we can save lives.
- <u>SB 586</u> Requires schools to use alternative approaches with students instead of suspending or expelling them. Working with our students to keep them in school is a top priority.
  - <u>SJ 26</u> Studies the cost and impact of our current felonization structure of certain drugs to ensure that we are approaching the drug epidemic in the most appropriate way while ensuring the safety of our communities.
