This week, I attended my first Companion Animals Sub-Committee hearing, cast my first votes in committee and on the floor, and presented my budget amendments for the 2024 Session.

#### **Budget Amendment Requests**

On Thursday, I presented my priority budget amendment requests to the Senate Finance and Appropriations Committee. These priorities include:

Re-establishing the Virginia Autism Advisory Council. This new council is larger than the previous Autism Advisory Council, and would be comprised of 16 members, 12 of which are non legislative citizens. The Council would provide an opportunity to discuss and advocate for issues that arise in the Autism community.

Providing funding for restorative alternatives in Virginia's public schools. This would add evidence-based restorative practices to the list of alternatives to suspension and to consider these alternatives before resorting to exclusionary discipline to ensure that our students are in school learning.

Establishes a work group headed by the Board of Education, in collaboration with the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, to study and make recommendations on guidelines for the use and integration of AI technology in education.

#### **Second Week in Session**



Last week I had my first Companion Animals Sub-Committee meeting and I voted on bills that strengthened animal protections. I also heard bills in Local Government, Education and Health, and Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources Committees ranging in topics including emissions regulations, charter amendments, free student lunch in our public schools.

I met with advocates from New Virginia Majority, including renters who discussed the impact of rising rent prices.



I was thrilled to have CASA visit to advocate for immigrant and working-class families.



I had the opportunity to meet with multiple medical professionals and discuss ways to better serve our communities to ensure Virginians have access to health and dental care.
