Budget Updates

Last week, I joined my colleagues in Richmond for a Special Session to pass a budget that includes record investments in education and teacher salaries, one of my #1 priorities and promises to my constituents. I have been proud to work with my

colleagues across chambers and across the aisle, but there is still work to do!

Here are some of the highlights:

Public Education

Overall, provides a total of \$2.1 billion GF above the FY 2024 base budget

Medicaid

Fully funds \$745.2 million GF over the biennium for the Medicaid and children's health insurance forecasts

Transportation

Includes \$65.0 million GF in the first year and \$84.5 million GF the second year for additional operating assistance for the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA)

Commerce and Labor

- •Contains \$175.0 million GF for the Virginia Housing Trust Fund to support the creation or preservation of affordable housing
- •Adds \$30.0 million in FY 2025 to help with costs related to "make ready" work on American Rescue Plan Act-funded broadband infrastructure projects


I know as road repaving begins many of you have reached out to our office to understand the paving schedule and let us know that your roads are in need of paving / unsafe. Please continue to do that
